Refunds/Cancellations

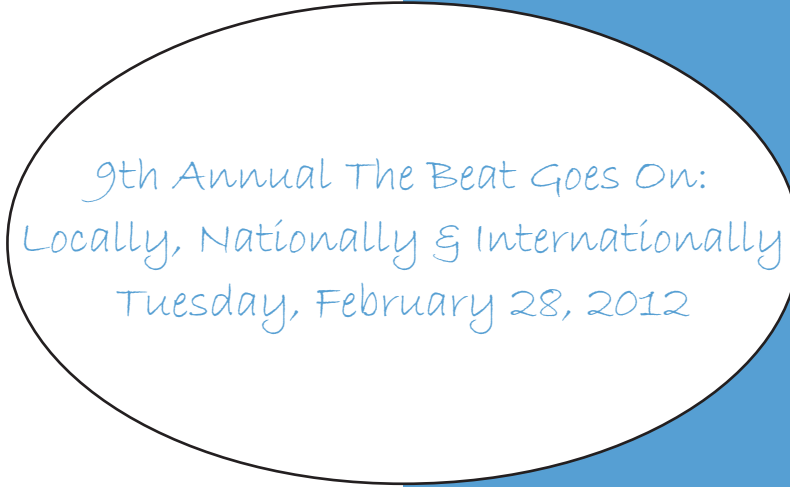

Description

Attendees of the 9th Annual **The Beat Goes On** Conference will learn about new treatments for patients with atrial fibrillation, pulmonary hypertension and heart failure available within our state of North Carolina, throughout the United States and beyond to the world. Participants will also hear about interventional radiology procedures and long-term ventricular assist devices. Presenters include well-known physicians and nurses from UNC who specialize in cardiology, cardiac surgery and interventional radiology.

Additionally, we welcome Dr. Karen Marzlin from CardioNursing to discuss The Power of Personal Leadership and Abby Poms from Duke University to present information on the diagnosis and treatment of patients with pulmonary hypertension. Finally, we will hear about International Medical Missions from UNC Hospital staff who have coordinated international trips including the benefits to the patients and healthcare providers who are involved.
